Declarer's Desperation Plays Paid-off With Made Contract

Hands that are played at high contracts usually provide more excitement than the lowly part score. However, there can be a tremendous amount of play in a low contract. One of the most action-packed hands I have ever seen was the one shown today, played at only two spades.

West opened the deuce of clubs, obviously a singleton, East played the jack, and South won with the ace. South realized that it was necessary to draw trumps quickly to prevent West from getting too many ruffs. Since two spade tricks had to be lost no matter

hoping to win the trick. It was a good idea, but actually East was able to win with the queen of diamonds.

East now returned another club, and South had to make an early decision. He finally decided that West would not have been so anxious to give his partner the lead if he held both the ace and queen of spades, since both would be tricks in any case.

South therefore ruffed with the king of spades to shut out the trump, dropping West's queen and East's ace on the same trick.

South's troubles were not yet over. He had already lost five tricks and needed the rest. With

how the trumps were divided, South quite properly began that suit by leading the deuce of spades from his hand.

East won with the jack of spades, cashed the king of clubs, and led the four of clubs for his partner to ruff.

West ruffed with the ten of spades and promptly returned the three of diamonds. South put up dummy's jack of diamonds,

West ruffed with the ten of spades and promptly returned the three of diamonds. South put up dummy's jack of diamonds,

only one trump in dummy and it was then easy to ruff the nine and two possible heart losers in his own hand, the situation was ticklish.

After winning the ace of spades, East returned a diamond, and South ruffed. He then cashed the ace and king of hearts.

It was clear that West had started with three spades and one club. The play had also indicated that West had started with five diamonds.

The West hand therefore counted out to exactly four hearts. Those hearts had to include the queen, since otherwise West would not have had enough strength for an opening bid.

With the courage of desperation South led the jack of hearts from his hand, hoping to pick up the ten of hearts in the East hand. West played low, and South led the jack of hearts ride.
