"You're both such fine fellows that I can't make up my mind which of you I like better," said Generous George. "I'll tell you what I'll do though. I'll give you this trick and you can decide between you who deserves it more. Anything you say is all right with me."

"We're really touched," growled West. "Some day you're going to get laryngitis and then you won't be able to play bridge."

West had opened the ten of diamonds, and Generous George let it ride around to his queen. George did a little thinking and decided that West was undoubtedly void of clubs. It wasn't too much to expect that East had the seven missing clubs for his

of spades from his hand and made his little speech. West dared not put up the ten of spades because, although he could cash another spade, he would then be forced to lead diamonds. Dummy would be able to win a trick with the jack of diamonds and take the hearts. West therefore played a low spade, hoping that his partner could exit safely in clubs. East was obliged to win with the nine of spades and lead the clubs. When East led the ten of clubs, George let it ride around to dummy's jack. Dummy could then cash the remaining hearts after which George's own hand was good for the rest of the tricks.

In addition, West's prompt rescue at three diamonds indicated extreme shortness in clubs. Finally, the fact that West had led away from his king of diamonds (not an attractive lead) indicated that he didn't have even a singleton club to lead.

At the second trick, George led the jack of hearts, holding the trick. He continued hearts, and West properly held up his ace until the third round.

West then shifted to the four of spades, and George really outdid himself in his attempt to be generous to his opponents. When East played the ace of spades, George dropped the queen!

East tried to get out by leading the jack of spades, and George won with the king. It was at this point that George led the three

'Meet the Press' Suing Mutual

NEW YORK, Aug. 29. (AP) Lawrence Spivak and Martha Rountree, owners and producers of the radio program, "Meet the Press," have sued the Mutual Broadcasting System for \$1,250,000.

They claim Mutual replaced their program with a copy called "Reporters Roundup" less than a week after dropping "Meet the Press" on Aug. 4.

Their complaint, filed in State Supreme Court here yesterday, said "Meet the Press" started in 1944, featuring newspaper-type interviews with prominent persons. Last May, Spivak and Rountree said, Mutual gave notice it would cancel an agreement, running to the end of 1952, to carry the program.
