"West opened the queen of spades, and South won with the king. He finessed the 10 of hearts, and East took the jack. East returned the jack of diamonds, and South won with the ace. He led a heart to dummy to finesse the jack of clubs.

"West won with the king of clubs, false-carding his possession of the queen. He then returned the jack of spades, knocking out dummy's ace.

"East cashed the top diamonds and top hearts, hoping that one of the suits would break. On one of these tricks, West discarded his deuce of clubs.

"South knew that West had started with six spades and four cards in the red suits. He had already played two clubs and could have only one club left. South could not tell that West had kept
