Perils Described in Partly Cooked, Unprocessed Pork

Eating partly cooked or unprocessed pork may result in a disease called trichinosis which causes muscular soreness, fever, and swelling under the eyes.

It is a painful and sometimes fatal disease caused by wormlike parasites called trichinae. Pork in any form can carry the parasite. Because sausage often contains pork which is frequently not thoroughly processed, it is an important source of the disease in man. There is no practical test by which presence of trichinae in pork can be detected. Thus, the government stamp of approval on pork does not include assurance that trichinae are not present. There is no cure for trichinosis—no known way of getting the trichinae out of the human body once they have gotten in. Thus, the only solution to the problem of trichinosis is a program of prevention. Hogs get trichinosis by eating scraps of infected raw pork present in garbage or by eating infected rats. When humans eat infected pork which has not been thoroughly cooked or processed, the trichinae parasite burrows into their muscles and seals itself in the tissues in microscopic capsules, to be with them the rest of their lives. Until better methods of control are discovered, trichinosis can be decreased by following these rules:

ONE. In the home—cook all raw pork and pork products thoroughly until the meat is well-done throughout. Pink pork may be dangerous. Thirty minutes per pound is recommended for large cuts of pork. Pork sausage, especially, should be thoroughly cooked. Deep-freezing also kills trichinae. TWO. On the farm—do not feed scraps containing raw pork to hogs. All garbage should be thoroughly cooked. Burn or bury deeply, in quicklime, the carcasses of hogs that die on the farm. THREE. Everywhere—eliminate rats and mice which spread the trichinosis among hogs. Rats are a nuisance and their eradication could be effective against many diseases besides trichinosis.

The station will be on the air from 8 a. m. to 2 a. m. six days a week, Monday through Saturday. The broadcasting day will end at midnight on Sunday only. Friday the station will air two special programs in observance of its anniversary. The first will originate from the studio at 8:15 p. m., with the second scheduled to be broadcast from Turner Hall at 11:15 p. m.

Crops, Hampered by Cold, Make Little Progress

MILWAUKEE — (UP) — Most crops in Wisconsin have made slow progress in the past week because of cool weather. Meteorologist Howard Thompson said Wednesday. "But rains late last week helped many dry areas," he said. Cranberries were growing slowly, with some early varieties beginning to color. Frequent flooding of bogs because of cold weather, Thompson said, has depleted reservoirs in some areas. "Corn continued to lag behind normal," he said. "Some corn injured by frost was cut for silage." Frost Aug. 20 caused "considerable damage" to crops in northern Wisconsin lowlands, Thompson said, and scattered frost occurred in central and southwest areas. "Haying was the main activity on many farms last week and good to excellent yields of alfalfa and clover were reported," he said. "Threshing has been completed in most of southern and central Wisconsin but is in full swing in the north." Gardens and truck crops were improved by weekend rains, he said.
