170 Workers Go Out on Strike in Fort Wage Dispute

FT. ATKINSON — A wage dispute sent 170 workers of the Creamery Package Co. here out on strike Friday.

The company and union were reported about 14 cents apart in negotiations.

Members of the AFL Federal Labor union 20835 voted 144 to 11 on the same ballot Friday to reject a company offer of a 5-cent hourly wage increase and to go out on strike.

Bernard Wegner, president of the union, said pickets would be stationed around the plant on N. Main st. Tuesday.

About 110 office workers and engineering, time study, inspection, and research and development workers remained on the job.

R. R. Slates, plant manager, said no plans have been made for laying off of the workers still on duty.

Both Wegner and Slates emphasized they were ready to bargain at any time either presented a proposal.

Wegner reported that the union is asking a 19-cent hourly wage increase to bring wages up to par with area rates for comparable work.

The union also is asking three weeks' paid vacation for 15-year employees, who now get 17 days; an increase in company insurance from \$1,000 to \$1,500, and increases in hospital room payments from \$5 to \$6 per day.

Blackwood on Bridge

This hand illustrates a sound piece of advice about opening two bids.

Don't open with a two bid when your long suits are shoddy, as Mr. Muzzy's hand and diamond suits were in today's deal.

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable. North (Mr. Champion) A 4 3 2, 6 3, 9 7 5, 10 9 6 5, 10 8 7, J 8, K 6, Q 10 8 4, K Q, 10 8 6 3 2.

The bidding: South West North East 2♥ Pass 2NT Pass 3♥ Pass 3NT Pass 4♥ Deal All Pass.

Have countable hands. By "countable" I mean hands containing suits that are solid enough so that you can accurately gauge their trick-taking ability.

Look at Mr. Muzzy's hand. How can you possibly tell how many tricks it will take? You can't.

It depends on many factors: How the outstanding high cards are distributed among the other

Not that he had reason to like no trump, but at least the hand would have been better played by Mr. Champion — and it wouldn't have been doubled.

Mr. Dale's double of the four heart contract was a lucky shot. Based on his cards alone he had no double.

But he knows Mr. Muzzy's two bids and he hoped this was one of the weaker ones. It looked as if he could win two hearts and a club so that there wasn't much danger of a redouble and any overtricks being scored.

And then there was the likelihood that Mr. Muzzy would drop at least one trick in the play.

Right, Mr. Muzzy won the opening spade lead with the queen and, seeing no profitable entry to dummy, promptly banded down the ace and another heart.

He went down three, losing three hearts, two diamonds, and a club.

Mr. Muzzy had an "uncountable" hand with 5½ honor tricks. Note how much better he would have done if he had held a countable hand something like this:

♠ A 7 6 5, ♥ K Q J 9 7, ♦ A K Q, ♣ 2.
