Bill's Bold 'Bad' Bidding Pays Off With This Hand

BILL, the bold bad bidder, was in to see me yesterday. He said, "You've been giving Generous George, Larceny Lou and Pessimistic Pete all the publicity lately. How about one of my good hands for a change?" "Do you ever have any?" I asked. Bill is famous for getting asked.

"Well, here's one in which I fixed up old Pete with a little help from my partner. Don't criticize my spade overall. It worked. As for Pete, his bidding did not show his usual pessimism, but his play did."
