STORY: Detective Mark Dixon has an ugly reputation on the force for brutality. So when-in self defense—he accidentally kills a suspect, he knows no one will believe the truth. He uses his ex-pert knowledge to cover up the crime but something goes wrong. And soon he discovers he has unintentionally framed the father of the girl he loves.

HIGH POINTS: Dixon coolly goes about disposing of the dead man's body in full view of his halfdozing landlady . . . desperately trying to untangle the knot he's trying to untangle the knot he's tied himself into, he attempts to beat a gangster into "confessing" the murder . . and finally steels himself to try another solution . . Andrews' tight-lipped, harshvoiced portrayal of the detective. . . Gene Tierney who has nothing much to do but look lovely but does that with accomplished skill. Ben Hecht's smooth writing

of the screen play, backed up with imaginative direction. LOW POINTS: In spite of obvious efforts, the attempt to dupli-cate the Andrews-Tierney chiller "Laura" doesn't quite come off— the inevitable outcome of the story being pre-determined by the

movies' morality code. VERDICT: Much better than average of its type, "Where the Sidewalk Ends" is persuasive and often exciting and good entertainment in its own right. It's only when you compare it to the memorable "Laura" that you get that let-down feeling.


