Is The Madison Housing Authority Deliberately Publicizing LIES?

Or Do The Answers To Loaded Questions Imply That The M.H.A. Is Double-Crossing The Public?

The Following Excerpts Are Presented to Madison's Citizens So They May Consider and Judge

The Facts About Government "Low Cost" Housing Entailing Home Demolition Proposed By M.H.A.

No Entire Blocks In City Classified As 'Slum Areas,' Frazier Reports

Spikes Rumors of Big Areas to Be Cleared for Housing Projects

NO entire blocks in Madison have been classified as "slum areas" as a result of the Madison Housing Authority's 1949 housing survey, William L. Frazier, MHA executive director, said today.

Frazier issued this statement to assure local residents, particularly those in the central part of the city, that their homes are not in a "slum block" and that no block ever has been classified as such by the MHA.

MANY HOME owners in the central area are concerned over rumors which have appeared in the Wisconsin State Journal recently, inferring that their blocks are in danger of being cleared to make way for a low-rent housing project because these areas have been termed as "slums" by the MHA.

"The MHA has classified no block as a slum area," Frazier declared. "The MHA has repeatedly stressed that Madison's sub-standard and blighted housing is in scattered areas."

"In order to classify any one block as a slum area, the block would have to contain a high percentage of heavily dilapidated structures. There are no such blocks in the city."

The city council has asked the MHA to withhold the location of these scattered substandard houses to avoid embarrassing occupants of the houses.

FRAZIER POINTED out that the areas for the MHA survey were selected on the basis of the city's 1940 census report which showed certain dwellings on the downgrade.

"If the report showed one house in a block which was on the downgrade, the whole block was surveyed," he explained. "The survey found no areas in which there were heavy concentrations of bad housing."

"The data set forth in TABLE XI are presented in terms of (a) blocks that should be completely cleared and (b) blocks that should be partially cleared.

"In summary terms the table shows that nine city blocks containing 133 structures and 257 dwelling units should be completely cleared."

"A total of 167 structures and units totalling 275 spread over 20 blocks might be razed under this aspect of the clearance plan."

"IN TOTAL TERMS the combined programs of complete and partial clearance would involve 29 city blocks, 300 structures, and 532 dwelling units with a concentration of clearance need in survey areas 1, 3 and 4."
