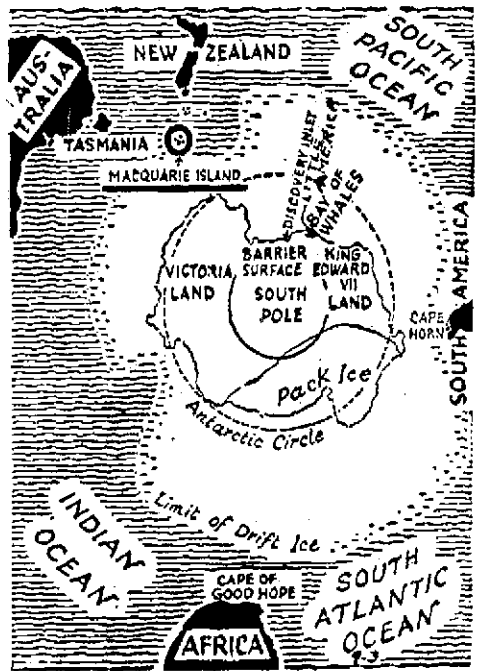
Uncle Roy's Corner
