Recommissioning of Hospital Ship to Be on Video

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 14. Recommissioning ceremonies for the hospital ship Haven, which will replace the Benevolence, sunk at San Francisco, will be televised, KLAC-TV announced today.

The television station said this would mark the first time such an event has been telecast.

Vice Adm. George D. Murray, commander of the Western Sea Frontier, and 11th Naval District Commandant, Rear Adm. Wilber

D. Baker, will participate in the ceremonies at Los Angeles Harbor tomorrow returning the Haven to the fleet.

Since the Haven was ordered out of mothballs 15 days ago after the Benevolence sank, 700 Navy and civilian personnel have worked 24 hours a day to recondition the ship.
