**Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT A New Gildersleeve**

Tip O' THE MORNING: Don't be surprised if Madison's Robert Clarke is elevated to movie stardom with (or soon after) release of his current picture, "Mother of a Champion."

Because Willard Waterman is a Madison man, and because radio has been accused so often of being consistently cold and its people slaves to clocks and clients, we thought you'd like to read this report on what happened in Hollywood on Wednesday, Sept. 6, when Waterman played "The Great Gildersleeve" for the first time...  
 Backstage at NBC's Studio A in Hollywood had been emotionally charged since noon rehearsals until, at air time, was a physical force... This was "Gildersleeve's" 10th fall opener, but unlike any before it, "Gildy" was to be a new man, literally—Willard Waterman... Big as he is, to him the shoes he was stepping into looked even bigger... The studio audience caught the electricity as Announcer John Hiestand introduced Waterman and he stepped to the "mike" for the warmup—needing it far more than the audience...  
 The young woman in the front row said it for all the guests... "Oh-h-h, it's not the same one!" Her disappointment was as obvious as Willard's tight paleness and trembling script hand... He knew there was a chip on every shoulder, there and across the country, and he knew what he had to do... And then the red light flashed... Birdie and Leroy were at the mike in the opening scene and Willard walked to the wings, where his friend, Jack Easton, was waiting with a pitcher of water, cups, and towel to wipe off beads of perspiration... On mike at last and his first words as "Gildersleeve" The young woman in the front row hunched to the edge of her seat in judgment, cocked her head to listen closely, then smiled and sat back... And she chuckled aloud when Waterman played his greeting to Marjorie so realistically that he left a reddened imprint of his fingers on her arm... At the end of his first scene, applause from studio and the rest of the cast was spontaneous... And on one trip to the wings, Willard almost had his arm wrung off by Director Frank Pittman, who had left his post in the control room to say, "Bill, it's going great, Don't worry about a thing. You're in!" At sing-off, no cues were needed to rouse the audience to applause... The red light went off it swelled to an ovation to the man who stood alone at the "mike" in center stage... The pounding of hands ignored his grateful wave trying to stop it for a farewell word... The young lady in the front row, her eyes swimming and her hands reddening as she applauded, said—over and over—"He's wonderful... He's wonderful..."  
 The tribute was his but he knew they were not applauding an actor named Willard Waterman. It was for Throckmorton P. Gildersleeve... He turned it from him, indicating his supporting actors and actresses standing in the wings, and saying, "Aren't they a wonderful cast!"... And started it all over again... Curtains closed and actors, elements, agency men almost knocked him down, pump-handling his arm, beating Waterman on the shoulders and back, embracing him and filling the air with every known synonym to the word "wonderful"... In his dressing room, where the mirrors were plastered with telegrams, Mrs. Waterman waited for him. And it's only fair to say that weddings aren't alone in producing tears of happiness...

# MHA Issues Its Answers

## Series Prepares for Referendum

(EDITOR'S NOTE — This is the sixth of a series of questions and answers designed and issued by the Madison Housing Authority (MHA) board of commissioners in preparation for the November referendum on a public housing project here. It is issued under the signatures of Robert Strenger, chairman; William L. Frazier, executive director.)

**Question — Does the MHA now own and operate any public housing projects?**  
 Answer—Yes. The Truax temporary apartments consisting of 150 units and the Truax apartments consisting of 120 permanent units are owned and operated by MHA. In addition, MHA operates the Truax trailer park.

**Q. How were the Truax temporary apartments financed and does the federal government have control over them?**  
 A. 120 units of the 150 Truax temporary apartments were constructed with federal government aid under the 1946 Veterans' Emergency Housing Act (Title V of the Lanham act). Thirty units were constructed by MHA with city financial help. Subsequently the federal government, by direct contribution, turned over the 120 units to MHA; thus it no longer has any control, direct or indirect, over the 150 Truax temporary apartments.

**Q. Why are they called temporary apartments?**  
 A. Because they were originally converted from war department barracks built for an emergency period to meet the acute housing shortage. It is planned that they shall be torn down at the end of the emergency period. At present, however, the emergency still exists and a waiting list of applicants is on file with MHA of over 170 eligible veteran families.

**Q. Is the land on which the temporary project stands owned by the M.H.A.?**  
 A. No. It is city owned and the MHA pays ground rent to the city amounting to \$1.25 per apartment unit per month or \$15 per year for each apartment. This amounts to \$2,250 per year.

**Q. What other money does the M.H.A. pay to the city in connection with the Truax temporary project?**  
 A. In addition to ground rent, MHA pays the city for water and sewer and also makes a payment in lieu of taxes.

**Q. How much has the payment in lieu of taxes been on the Truax temporary project and how is it computed?**  
 A. Total payment for 1949 was \$8,070.70. This resulted from a \$2,100 assessed valuation placed on each temporary apartment, and a tax rate of 26.45 mills (equivalent to the county and state tax).

**Q. What size, shape and structure are the temporary apartments?**  
 A. They are small, running three four-room apartments to a building. The single story buildings are grouped at intervals so that there is play space for children and gardens. Each apartment is equipped with gas stove, cooler, hot water heater, flush toilet and shower.

**Q. How were tenants selected to live in these temporary apartments?**  
 A. No one is eligible unless he fulfills certain requirements, namely: the head of the family must be
