Hermann Sons Annual Carnival To Begin Friday

The 24th annual Hermann Sons Carnival will be held Friday through Sunday, Oct. 1, in the Hermann Sons Garden at 523 S. St. Mary's St., fronting the San Antonio River, it is announced by Fred Heberer, president of the organization. Attendance of 4,000 is expected, Heberer said.

He added that the 1950 carnival will be "bigger and better than ever." There will be more than 40 booths and stands, dancing every night, and tasty home-cooked meals. Members of the nine San Antonio Hermann Sons lodges, with a membership of more than 3,000, will devote their time to the carnival.

A special feature will be music by the All-Blind Band, sponsored by the Lighthouse for the blind, on Saturday night.

At a program on Sunday afternoon there will be music by the Hermann Sons Band, directed by Otto Zoeller. The principal speaker will be Judge W. A. Morrison of the court of criminal appeals. Greetings will be presented by Mayor Jack White, County Judge Charles W. Anderson, Sheriff Owen Kilday and Com. Raymond South.

New Cushing Bids Sought

The city council Thursday tossed out previous bids for removal of Camp Cushing, Negro Housing project, to a new location and set a new minimum requirements for bids to be opened next Thursday.

In a lengthy session marked with a sharp exchange of opinion between the mayor and commissioners, the council decided not to "negotiate" a sale of 31 buildings which contain 100 rental units.

The two bidders for the property, which must be vacated before the end of January, 1951, are E. J. Burke, of San Antonio, and H. L. Harvey, Fort Worth.

The council has set up a stringent set of requirements to prevent the units from turning into slums when they are converted.
