CBS Radio, Video Covers Joe Louis Bout at 7 P. M.

NEW YORK, Sept. 27. (AP) A television hookup of 32 stations in as many cities and the full radio network will carry the CBS broadcast of tonight's heavyweight championship bout between Ezzard Charles and Joe Louis. The radio chain will be augmented by 25 or so extra stations through arrangement with the sponsor.

Air time is 7 p. m. Ted Husing will announce for television and Russ Hodges and Jack Brickhouse for radio. In case of postponement of the outdoor event to Thursday night because of weather, the same broadcast set-up will be in effect.

In addition to the direct TV relay, 26 non-connected stations are to carry film recordings a day or so later.

Fred Allen is still Fred Allen, but his new television show didn't exactly live up to advance billing. At least that was the reaction of one familiar with his particular radio technique.

There seemed to be just too many of Fred's gimmicks missing in his TV debut as a monthly feature of the NBC comedy hour on Sunday nights. Portland, Hoffa (Mrs. Allen) so long a fixture in the radio show, wasn't there, to name one.

Also Allen's Alley, was turned into a puppet show with the familiar voices coming off stage and resulting in a loss in effect.

Except when Fred was dispensing the homey type of humor in which he specializes the show smattered of a musical revue of the type one would not expect to be built around him. Although generally entertaining, it lacked the high-speed tempo already set in this series by Eddie Cantor and Martin and Lewis.

Another of radio veterans, Morton Downey, has returned to TV for his second year, having moved from NBC to CBS. His new one for Friday nights is more of a Godfrey type talent series (without prizes and with Morton as a desk-sitting host) than a Downey song session. Titled "Star of the Family" the program's guests were doing parents with talented offspring—no age limit either way—who in most instances were professional.

Jack Baker, with a daily disc jockey show, has replaced the Red Foley program on the NBC radio network. Baker, former ABC Breakfast Club singer, specializes in western and folk records. Jerry Lester, now qualified as a late night comic three times a week in the NBC City Broadway Open House, is to be awarded a "President's Citation" by the Poor Richard Club of Philadelphia tonight for his video activities.
