## L. B. Man's Hit Tune on Band Program Today

Long Beach's Municipal Band included an old-time hit tune, "Harmony Rag," on its 2 p. m. program today, that was written in 1911 by Hal Nichols, owner-manager of radio station KFOX, Long Beach, and just recently re-issued by the Sam Fox Music Publishing Co., an international firm with offices in New York, London, Hollywood and other cities.

The ragtime tune became a 1911-12 hit tune despite the fact that it was instrumental only. Later lyrics were added by the famed team of Bill Carr and Leon Corday, lyricists of dozens of other hit songs.

Today's performance follows others, several on nation-wide radio broadcasts, since the tune's reissue.
