President Truman's address to the people on his return from Wake Island and the historic conference with Gen. MacArthur will be broadcast tonight by major radio stations. The stations and exact time when the radio broadcasts will start as announced by the station managers are shown in the regular log printed below. The address will be delivered from the Memorial Auditorium at San Francisco, where the United Nations was created.

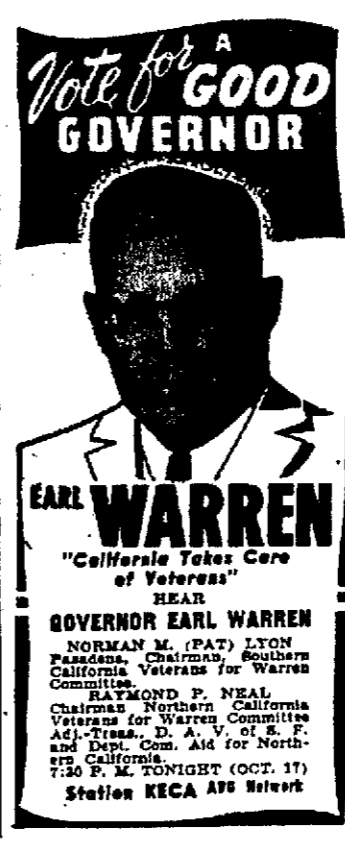
Oakland Woman Sees Huge Snake

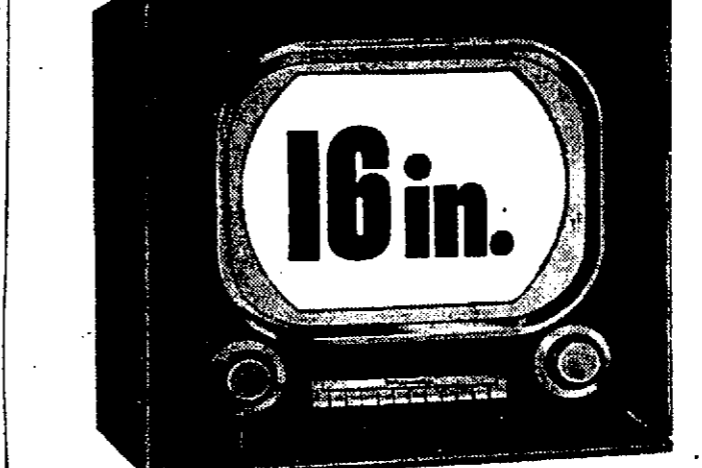

Nationalist Army Rids Self of Paper Soldiers

TAIPEI, Formosa, Oct. 17. (AP) Nationalist China says it has rid the country of one of its worst enemies—the paper soldier.

Paper soldiers are non-existent troops whose pay and provisions are collected by division commanders in the old Nationalist army paper soldiers often made up half or more of most forces. To rid the army of these ghost troops, the government decreed that division commanders can not draw the pay and rations of troops. Instead, representatives chosen by officers and men now get pay and provisions for the men.
