LIFE TERMER AIRS MESSAGE

Broadcast From Behind Bars Warns Juveniles

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 18. (AP) His radio time purchased with a dollar paid by the sheriff, a convict facing life in prison pleaded with juveniles to stay out of trouble.

"The only big shot is the man who carries a lunch pail," said James J. Newman, 38, awaiting transfer to Folsom Prison for life under California law because he has been convicted four times of felonies.

Sheriff Eugene Bleasill said it is the first time a broadcast has been made from behind

county jail bars. It was Newman's idea, said the sheriff, after the convict heard of a radio program on which a minute of air time can be purchased for a dollar.

CBS said Newman's remarks were taped for use on its show, "Dollar a Minute."

Newman said help "is something we didn't get when I was a youngster." Then he added: "The only thing I can think of to keep them off the streets, drive-ins, out of beer joints, is to open playgrounds at night and put in some constructive work where they can help themselves. Clubs would be a help if the police would put them in where the kids could help themselves now, not later on."

"The only big shot is the man who carries a lunch pail. Why? Because he is a free man. He goes home at night when his work is through. He doesn't have to worry about being locked up in a cell."
