Lehman Has No Apology

DUBLICATION of a second personal letter by a candidate for the Senate kept national political attention focussed today on the heated New York campaign.

Sen. Herbert H. Lehman (D.-Lib.-N. Y.) said he had no apology to make for a two-year-old letter of the second painting, he said.
