September State Aid Gains 8.3% Over '49 Public assistance grants total-ling \$4,124,343 went to 104,052 persons in Wisconsin in September, the department of public welfare reported Friday. The amount of aid represented an 8.3 per cent gain over September. 1949. Old age assistance, for 53,159 recipients, aggregated \$2,622,352.
