California Cotton Pickers' Strike Ends

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30. (AP) A final settlement of a strike involving 20,000 California cotton pickers has been announced by the A. F. L. National Farm Labor Union. Union President H. L. Mitchell said the workers had obtained a wage increase of 50 cents per 100 pounds, equivalent to \$1 per day for the pickers. Mitchell said a picking rate of \$4 per 100 pounds was originally demanded by the union but that it accepted \$3.50 offered by the California farm owners.
