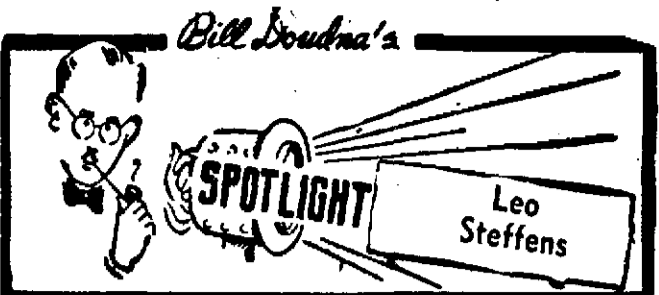

TIP O' THE MORNING: Despite rumors to the contrary, there are plenty of good tickets left for Jose Limon's dance recital Nov. 14 in the Wisconsin Union theater.

"That music began to get under my skin," said the gentleman in the adjacent seat. "But I guess it was supposed to."

It was, and the gentleman wasn't alone in his feeling. The music was Ravel's "Gaspard de la Nuit," and the musician was Prof. Leo Steffens, pianist and member of the University of Wisconsin music faculty.

Steffens played in the Wisconsin Union theater for an audience which enthusiastically called him back for several bows and two encores.

His performance of Brahms' "Rhapsody in B Minor," with a sweeping power, sparked the first half of the concert, but the Ravel work in the second section almost had the audience off the seats.

Steffens played the insinuating "Scarbo," the flowing "Ondine," and the mournful "Le Gibet"—almost gruesome in its picture of a scaffold and its burden—with deep absorption and in sure projection of the music.

He performed other works, too, with skill and understanding—the brilliant "Hungarian Rhapsody No. 11" of Liszt, a dazzling Chopin serenade, Brahms' "Capriccio, Opus 76, No. 1" and Bach's "French Suite in G Major"—a dance set in which some of the rhythms could have been a bit steeper.

Encores were one of Mendelssohn's "Songs Without Words" and Ravel's "Piece in the Form of a Habanera."

U. W. Law Professor Has Book Published

Delmar Karlen, associate professor of law at the University of Wisconsin, has written a "Primer of Procedure" calculated to introduce the terminology and procedures of law painlessly to beginning law students and laymen.

The book is published by the Campus Publishing Co., 823 University ave.

"The book attempts to cover the whole subject," Karlen said. "Instead of cases and notes, an informally written text is used, supplemented by and cross-referenced to the record of trial of an actual lawsuit and a modern code of procedure—the federal rules."

Part one of the book, "Analysis of a Modern Lawsuit," is divided into chapters on the summons, the complaint, the defendant's response, the trial practice, the trial, motions after verdict, judgment and execution, and appeals.

Part two is concerned with law and equity and includes chapters on the common law, equity, and reform, and the modern judicial system.

'Big Steel' USW to Resume Wage Talks

PITTSBURGH —(AP)—Top negotiators for big U. S. Steel Corp. and the CIO United Steel Workers (USW) got together for the third time today under a cloak of secrecy to try and iron out wage demands for nearly one million union members.

The secrecy is self-imposed. Philip Murray, blunt-speaking president of both the CIO and USW, is agreed on that point with John A. Stephens, vice-president in charge of industrial relations for 'Big Steel.'

Following their second meeting last week on Murray's request for a "very healthy and substantial" raise for his men who now average \$1.70 an hour, the two men issued a statement which said they've agreed a ban on progress reports is the best for all concerned.

Such a ban, the statement declared, will "give the conference the best possible chance to find a basis for settlement."
