Bill Douma's SPOTLIGHT Pro Arte Quartet

TIP O' THE MORNING: Watch for "A Bushel and a Peck" climb to the top of the various music surveys. It's already sixth on Madison's "your selection please" machine, three places ahead of "Goodnight, Irene."

Walter Piston's "Third Quartet" provided the greatest interest in Sunday night's concert by the Pro Arte quartet in Music hall, first of the season there. The group performed Mozart's "Quartet in G Major" admirably and Pianist Louise Lockwood Carpenter, Violinist Albert Rahler, and Cellist Ernst Friedlander gave a capable presentation of Beethoven's "Trio in E Flat Major."

Piston's music was by turns exhilarating and disturbing, but seldom dull, often combining attributes of traditional and modern composition. The first movement (allegro) had the unusual method of stating a theme in unison or conservative harmony, then sending it off in four directions at once. The second movement (lento) had passages of haunting beauty, but the third (allegro) seemed more concerned with startling the listener than with anything else.

Incidentally, Piston replaced a previously scheduled Stravinsky group, which will be played later. In both the Mozart and the Beethoven works, flowing cantabile movements came off best. The quartet in one and the trio in the other cared the ears with a superb ensemble playing and a sense of intimacy.

ORCHESTRA CONCERT: The University of Wisconsin Symphony orchestra will open its 1950-51 concert season in the Wisconsin Union theater at 8 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 19, with Ernst Friedlander of the Pro Arte quartet as soloist.

Conductor Richard C. Church is rehearsing his players three times weekly on Beethoven's overture, "Leonore" Sibelius' "Symphony No. 7" and the Ravel arrangement of Moussorgsky's "Pictures at an Exhibition." Friedlander will play Tchaikovsky's "Variations on a Roccoco Theme."

This concert is the orchestra's biennial performance to raise funds for orchestra keys and the annual page in the Badger. Tickets will be on sale at the Union box office.

WHA-FM listeners get a preview of the Friedlander-symphony combination Nov. 12 when Bloch's "Schelemo" will be broadcast.
