Steel Mills Set Output Record

CLEVELAND, Nov. 13. (AP) Still running at top speed, the nation's steel mills established a new record in October with 8,718,978 tons or 102 per cent of capacity, the magazine Steel reported today.

The trade publication also said the mills last week pushed production to the highest levels ever attained in history, jumping the ingot rate 4.5 points to 103 per cent of capacity. The latest increase, Steel added, was due almost entirely to settlement of the strike at Bethlehem Steel's Lackawanna mill. "January steel mill rolling schedules are being set up, but they hold little cheer for many factors of civilian goods," the weekly summary of the metal working industry continued. Supply conditions, it said, promise to deteriorate steadily under impact of defense and related demands.

Final Beatification Rites Held in Italy

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 13. (AP) In the final beatification ceremony of the Holy Year, Pope Pius XII yesterday raised Mother Marguerite Bourgeois to the blessed of the Roman Catholic Church. Born in France in 1620, she founded the order of the Sisters of Our Lady in the Canadian Wilderness 300 years ago. More than 1200 Canadian pilgrims and 40 archbishops and bishops were among the thousands of spectators at the ceremony in the Basilica of St. Peter.

Him Smart Indian! Dodged FBI Six Years

CROWN POINT, Ind., Nov. 13. (AP) The Indian disguise of Howard E. Lee Jr., carnival sword swallower and knife thrower from Chatham, Ont., didn't help him much in Lake County Jail today. F. G. Foster, FBI special agent, said agents spotted him, shoulder-length hair and all at the home of relatives in Crisman, Ind., and picked him up on a charge of deserting the U. S. Army six years ago.
