Cat Sought for Top Role in New Paramount Film

 HOLLYWOOD. (AP) Cats, cats, cats. Paramount is swarming with them—the four-legged kind. The invasion is due to a future movie called "Rhubarb." As any student of contemporary literature knows, that is the H. Allen Smith novel about a cat who inherits a major league baseball team.

Naturally, such a role calls for a cat of historic ability. Not any old cat will do. And so the studio is putting on a talent search which the publicity department hopes will be a feline version of the hunt for Scarlett O'Hara. I dropped by to witness the latest crop.

The reception room at the studio was filled with more than a dozen cats and their owners. Most of the animals were purring patiently but one or two made hissing comments about the talents of the other competitors. I eluded the outstretched paws of one would-be actor who seemed to have no liking for the press, and entered an office.

There I met the men who have fostered the search: Producers William Periberg and George Seaton and Director Arthur Lubin. I asked what they were looking for.

"Rhubarb must be a typical alley cat—large and striped," declared Lubin. "He has to be a good fighter and a great lover. It would help if he has a broken tail, but that's not essential."

Lubin is the man who directed Francis, the talking mule. He expects more trouble with Rhubarb, even though the cat doesn't have to talk or do anything else uncatlike. "What's so difficult about cats?" I asked innocently.

"They're too dumb," volunteered Periberg. "Dumb—or independent?" I asked. "Dumb," agreed Seaton. "Al-

most any other animal is easier to direct. We have people who come in and say their cats can do tricks—but only in their own living rooms!"

The movie makers said the usual film animal trainers were unable to supply a suitable Rhubarb. Hence the search. About 100 cats have been interviewed at the studio already and more are prowling in day by day.

I watched some of them parade haughtily through the office, like show girls from a hit musical. Two of them staged a swinging and spitting match near Seaton's arm. "From now on just call me Lefty," he quipped.

Note to cat lovers: The opinions about the intelligence of cats are those of Messrs. Seaton, Periberg and Lubin and do not necessarily reflect those of this writer. And if you have a cat you think should play Rhubarb, see them, not me. I've got enough trouble.
