This review was written by Alfred Sessler, professor of art education at the University of Wisconsin. Sessler himself has won several prizes in past salons and other competitive exhibitions.

One of the better Wisconsin Salons of Art in recent years is the 16th now on view at the Memorial Union. The jury consisting of Zoltan Sepesby, Carl Gaertner, and John Socha combined, in their respective judgments, to gather a body of work that is broad in content and yet high in quality.

The success of a production depends upon the quality of its cast, and, since the principals have already been discussed in other writings, it is the intention of this reviewer to comment about some of the excellent "supporting cast."

The painting section of the exhibit, though not overly exciting nor bombastic, is stimulating and does contain a goodly number of works which display technical know-how.

Attracting attention through the force of its simplicity is Twilight, a small oil by Arthur Thrall. This work is conceived in terms of beautifully modulated browns which are punctuated with restrained touches of low keyed red and yellow spots which are used effectively to delineate subject matter. It is a simple, forthright statement.

Color reflected directly from its boldly painted surface characterizes City Church, an oil painting by George Fredriksen. The calligraphic treatment of the figures in the right of the canvas is used as an excellent foil to point up the juicy quality of paint in the major part of the work. However, it is this excellent relationship which calls attention to the heavy handed handling of the group entering the church itself. In spite of this the over all effect is quite rich.

Somewhat more successful is the semi-abstract encaustic painting Sunburst by Fred Kiefendorf. In this work the artist has distilled the utmost from the subject matter and medium that he has chosen to use. In this sensitive and close harmonized piece, Kiefendorf has used perspective lines which

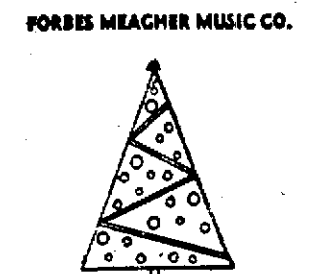
plunge into the picture plane and then are stopped quite successfully by the stylized symbol of the sun. The movement is cleverly distributed over the picture and the idea of sunburst is extended by the device of designed repetition. The intent of the painter to preserve a limited space feeling is quite well done.

A painting that will strike the casual observer as quite abstract is the Stretched Hides by Orville Soffa. Actually, this oil painting is a rather realistic handling of the subject. Color, design, and surface textures are tellingly used to bring up associations connected with the curing of hides.

One of the most subtle as well as pleasing works in the show is the wax painting by Fred Berman titled 3rd Ward Wall. This is a low keyed and closely related tonal work. Value contrasts are kept to a minimum. The use of lettering is unobtrusive and becomes a pictorial element rather than readable text which would certainly drown the mood the artist has obtained in this beautiful brown and tan tonality.

The lithograph by Eugene Meckalski is an excellent technical work. On cursory glance the impression is given that there is a tremendous amount of detail in this print. The artist has obtained this impression with a finely balanced relationship of suggestive lines and tones.

A superior print is the etching and aquatint by Richard Houghton. In this work, Temptation, the aquatint areas are brilliant and the linework is sure. The use of subtly laid lines in the tone areas gives the etching its richness and strength. There is a bit of conscious display of anatomical knowledge in the handling of the main figure.

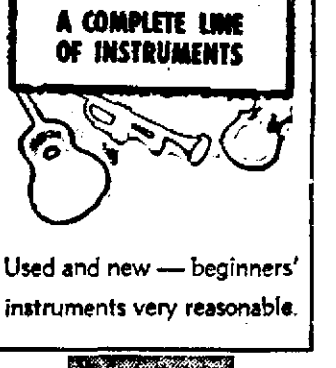

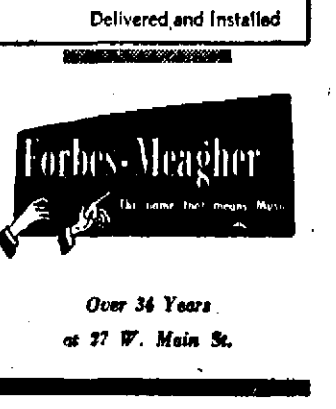
