Brother Held in Boy's Killing

CLEVELAND, Miss., Nov. 24. (AP) A series of bitter arguments led to the slaying of a 17-year-old boy by his younger brother.

County Attorney R. E. Jackson Jr. said Eugene Adams signed a statement that he shot his brother Alvin with a .22-caliber rifle at their home and then hauled the body to a Mississippi river levee.

Alvin was shot Tuesday while he slept, Jackson said. His body was found on the levee yesterday.

The 16-year-old younger brother was booked on a charge of murder.

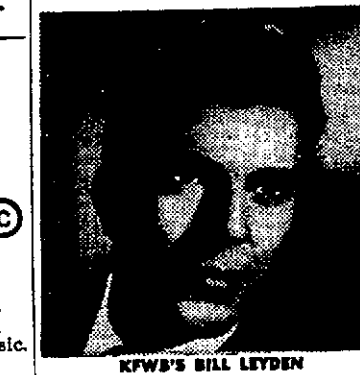
Jackson said a partly burned blanket found near Alvin's body matched others in the Adams home, and led to the younger brother's arrest.
