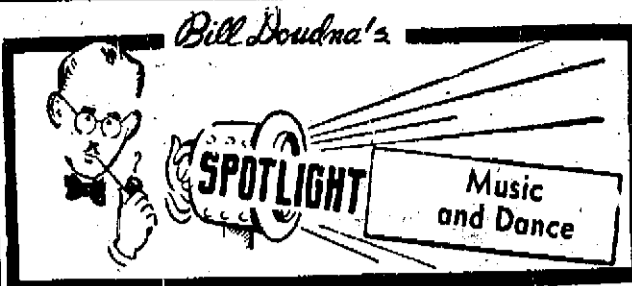

Despite snow and cold, the Masonic auditorium was filled to capacity Sunday afternoon for a young people's concert, and scores of would-be listeners were turned away. Because the central floor was to be used for dancing, seating capacity was reduced to 1,225, and this limit was reached shortly after 3 p.m.

Most of the seats were filled with youngsters, but there were lots of adults, too, and they enjoyed the music of the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra and a junior harp ensemble and the dancing of the Kathryn Hubbard dancers as much as the boys and girls.

Ballet made up the last half of the program. The young dancers, most of them in their teens, showed the results of careful training by Miss Hubbard as well as spirit, enjoyment, and some examples of unusual talent.

The music was from Tchaikovsky's "The Nutcracker," a favorite Christmas time ballet. Most of the choreography was by Miss Hubbard. In it there were great grace, fine fluidity, attractive patterns, and original ideas.

An accomplished dancer, he was equally at home in the comic "Chinese Dance" and the other numbers. Miss Tripalin was a capable partner.

A group of young tin soldiers in green and red, a quartet of dancing dolls in white and red, and an acrobatic clown (Frederick Nelson) made an instant hit in the first number, setting a high goal for the rest of the afternoon.

One of the outstanding talents revealed at the concert was that of Joan Taitferro, who appeared with Charlene Taylor in "Dance of the Reed Flutes," and whose grace and sense of ensemble were notable in the "Waltz of the Flowers."

The orchestra opened the program with Saint-Saens' "French Military March" and Strauss' "Perpetuum Mobile." The enjoyable harp ensemble answered the audience's insistent applause with an encore.

Walter Heermann conducted the orchestra, and Margaret Rupp Cooper had trained the harpists.
