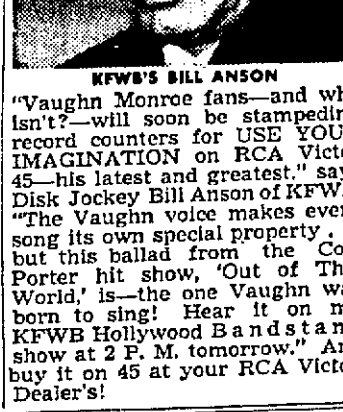


Mink Rancher Tells Theft of 500 Pelts
