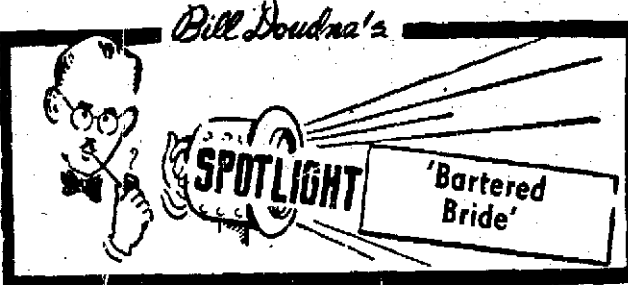

NEW SPADE: The new Sam Spade, one of radio's most-rewarding acting plums, is Steve Dunne. Dunne, playing with Lucretia Tuttle as Effie, Sam's adoring secretary, carries on his San Francisco capers on NBC's "New Adventures of Sam Spade" Fridays at 7:30 p. m. He was selected for the part in Hollywood by director-producer William Spier after a score of radio actors were auditioned.

Dunne comes to the role of Dashiell Hammett's brash private detective after 30 film credits and hundreds of West Coast radio and television performances. He was called up for the Spade audition as a result of a five-year-old note scribbled and filed by Spier. In 1945, the producer saw a movie called "Shock." Dunne played a small part in the film. Spier never met or interviewed the actor until 1950, when he sought the new Sam Spade after checking his file.

SILVER: An exhibition of handwrought silver designed and executed by art teachers at the Silversmithing Workshop conference last summer will open Dec. 4 at the University of Wisconsin. F. Carlton Ball, of the faculty, arranged for the four-day show. He was one of 12 teachers chosen to attend the conference in 1948. Evelyn Bauman, West high school teacher, was selected in 1949.

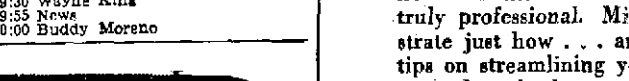
