**Industrial Output at Postwar High**  
WASHINGTON, Dec. 1. (AP) Industrial production hit a new postwar high in October and maintained the pace through November's first half, the Federal Reserve Board reported. The board's index of produc-

tion showed a three-point gain in October—meaning about 1½ per cent—and put the production level at 115 per cent above the 1935-1939 average, highest since July, 1945.
