GOP Leaders Make 'No Stalling' Pledge

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Senate Republicans pledged Thursday they will not resort to stalling or filibuster to block President Truman's measures in the lame duck session of congress.

The promise was made by Chairman Eugene D. Millikin (R-Colo.) of the senate Republican conference after a party huddle to discuss the outlook for the short session.

He said it was proposed by Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-O.), who is chairman of the senate GOP policy committee and a chief opponent of many administration programs.

Sen. Knowland Urges 48-Hour Ultimatum

SAN FRANCISCO — (AP) — U. S. Sen. William F. Knowland, (R-Calif.) said Thursday the United Nations (UN) must be effective as an agency for international law and order or it will become a "fraud upon the people of the world."

Here to address the annual meeting of the California state Chamber of Commerce, Knowland also said the UN should "invite" Russia out of the international organization and give Communist China 48 hours to withdraw her forces from Korea.

Knowland warned that the United States and the UN must adopt more forceful policies in the Far East or all Asia including Japan, Formosa, the Philippines and India will come under Communist rule.
