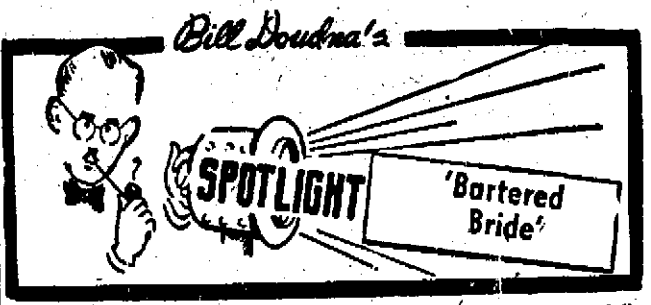

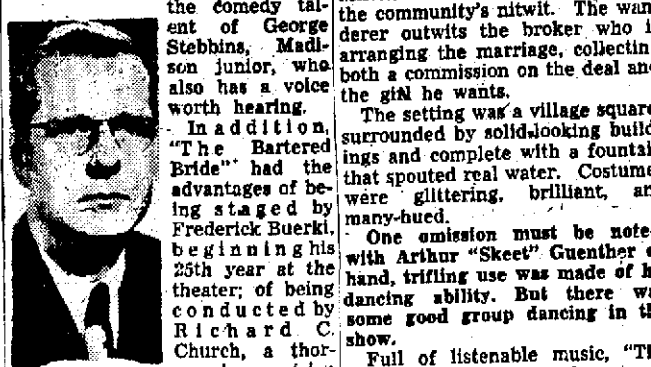

One of Madison's rare operatic productions opened Monday night at the Wisconsin Union theater and brought to its stage two fine talents—the staging of Edna Liessmann, University of Wisconsin senior from Wisconsin Dells, and the comedy talent of George Stebbins, Madison junior, who also has a voice worth hearing.
