Cardinal Assails Parley on Youth

SAN ANTONIO, Texas, Dec. 15. (AP) Francis Cardinal Spellman sharply criticized the recent mid-century White House conference on children and youth for its "strong opposition to God." The archbishop of New York said at a banquet in his honor yesterday that "strong opposition to God, to His holy name and to religion was bitterly expressed." He said, "Where the committee for conference regulations had wisely proposed that every community study some plan for teaching religion to all children in accordance with law and the desires of parents," the delegates opposed any use of public schools directly or indirectly for religious educational purposes. Spellman took part in dedication ceremonies of the Incarnate Word College's new science hall.

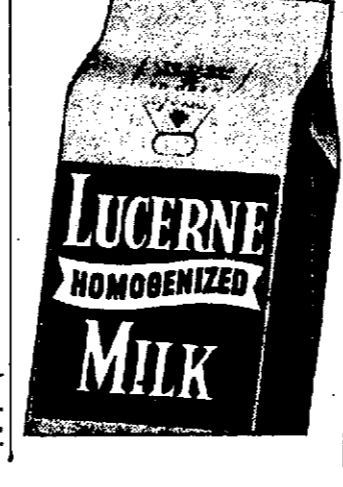
