## Milwaukee County Rejoins Society's View on Dog Law

MILWAUKEE — (P) — Oliver O'Boyle, Milwaukee corporation counsel, said Thursday the county cannot renew its dog pound contract with the Wisconsin Humane society if the society refuses to provide Marquette university medical school with animals for experimentation.

O'Boyle's opinion was given to the county board finance committee which is considering renewal of the annual \$36,000 contract.

The 1949 legislature enacted a law authorizing the Wisconsin and Marquette university medical schools to requisition animals for scientific research. The Wisconsin Humane society said it would not abide by the law.

O'Boyle declared Milwaukee county "would be joining with the society in violation of the state law" if it renewed its contract with the humane society. The society has told the finance committee the \$36,000 contract is an essential part of its annual budget.
