Nazi Hangman of Buchenwald to Be on Trial

FRANKFURT, Germany (U.P.)—German officials are preparing to try Martin Sommer, "hangman of Buchenwald concentration camp," for some of the worst atrocities perpetrated during the entire Nazi regime, it was announced Monday.

Former S S Sergeant

Somer, a former Nazi SS sergeant, was perhaps the most notorious of all murderers and torturers of the 50,000 prisoners in Buchenwald camp.

Blame Back to Life

While was crimes agents were seeking "the hangman of Buchenwald," the Americans unwittingly nursed Sommer back to life. As an SS man he was automatically interned.

But in 1948, nobody ever having

accused him of any crime, he was handed to the Germans, still a physical wreck. The Germans put him into one of their best hospitals, themselves unaware of his identity, and spent thousands of dollars to keep him alive and patch him up.

A few months ago Sommer's wife came to Western Germany from the Soviet zone, asking to see him so she could arrange a divorce. His identity was disclosed.

Prosecutor Ilkow hastened to the war veterans hospital at Bayreuth, where Sommer was a patient.

"Sure I am the Martin Sommer of Buchenwald," Sommer admitted. "Nobody ever asked me before or I would have admitted it. I only did what I was ordered to do."
