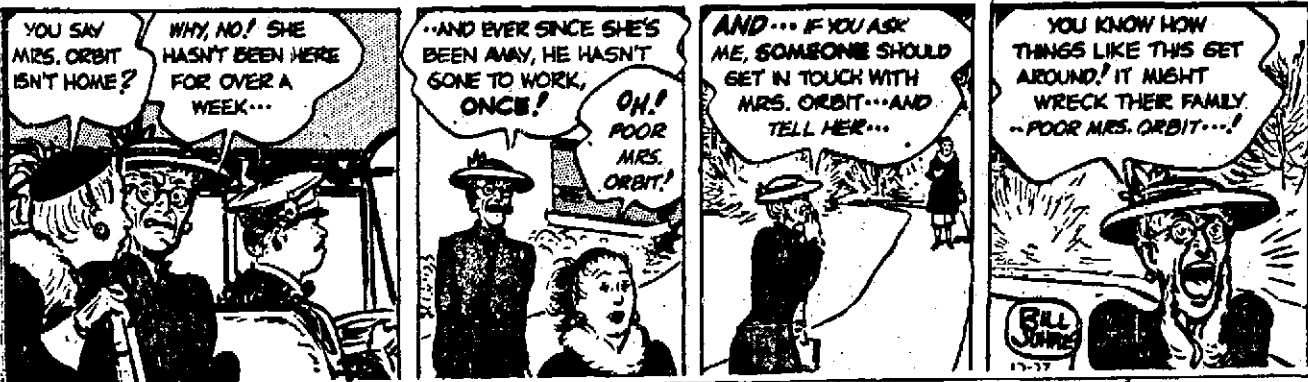

Blackwood on Bridge

(By Easley R. Blackwood) Here is a bidding situation which Mr. Muzzy consistently fails to understand. He doubles for a takeout and his partner responds. Now, no matter what happens later, no matter how many times the opponents bid and his partner passes, Mr. Muzzy finds it impossible to accept the fact his partner may have an absolute bust hand. He makes no allowance for the fact that his partner was FORCED to bid by the double. Actually when you respond to your partner's double you are not making a "bid" in the sense that you have freely decided your hand warrants an attempt to buy the contract for your side. You are merely obeying your partner's command to show your best suit. East dealer. Both sides vulnerable. Pass 1 S Dbl. Pass 2 H Pass 3 H Pass 4 H All Pass If, unfortunately, your best suit is headed by a nine spot, that is no fault of yours. You have to do the best you can with what was dealt to you. One angle of this situation cropped up in today's hand. Miss Brash opened the bidding with one heart and Mr. Muzzy doubled (on little enough, incidentally). Mr. Abel saw no reason to take any action at this point. Mr. Champion dutifully and properly bid one spade. From here on the opponents battered their way into a four heart contract—with Mr. Muzzy on the lead. No doubt you have already guessed what he led. You're right — the ace of spades. Why not? His partner had "bid" spades. To Mr. Muzzy, it looked like the best lead one could ask for. But when the ace of spades hit
