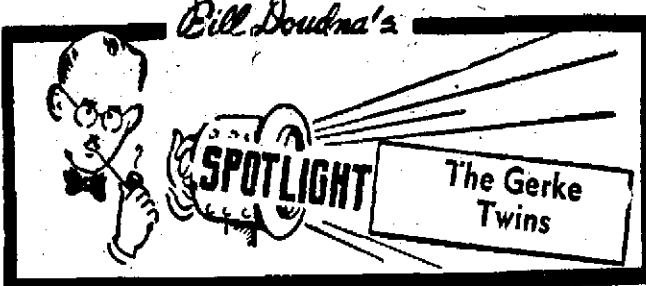
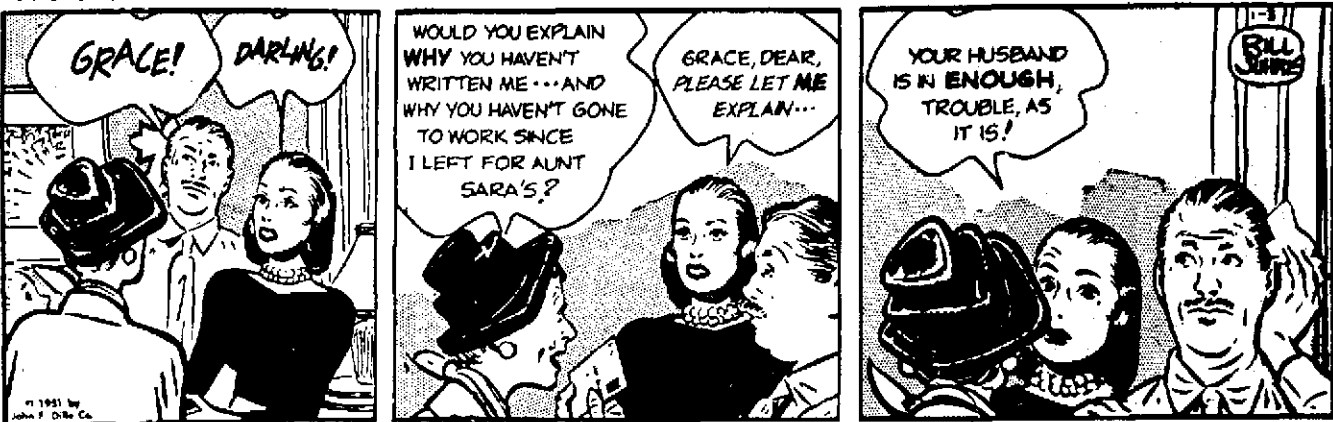


The Orbits

Prospective contestants are being asked to write for the contest's folder of rules at this address: "Dr. Christian Award, 17 State St., New York 4, N. Y."

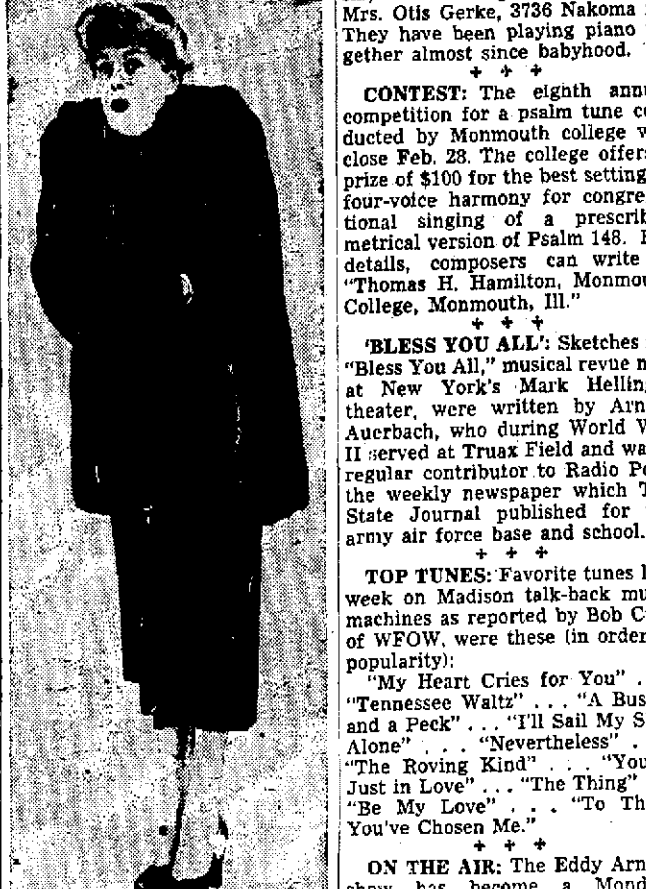

Mr. Muzzy violated a sound principle of defensive play on this hand. That principle is: Don't lead a singleton when you have as many as four trumps. In this situation it is usually better to try to force declarer by leading your own long, strong suit. If you can force declarer to trump often enough, you may gain control of the trump suit yourself. South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.
