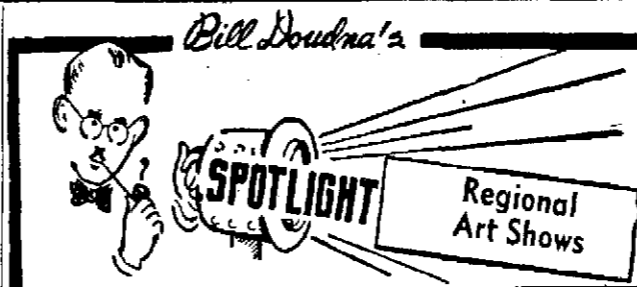

TIP O' THE MORNING: Pres. Truman's message to congress on Monday will be broadcast at noon by WIBA, WIBA-FM, WISC, and WISC-FM.

Two rural art shows will be held this year instead of the usual single exhibition. James A. Schwalbach said Thursday. Schwalbach is in charge of the shows for the state's cooperative extension work in agriculture and home economics.

Growth of the junior division of the annual event has led to a decision to divide the exhibition, with an adult show May 26 to June 11 in the Memorial Union and a junior show during the University of Wisconsin summer session, also in the Memorial Union.

This will be the 11th annual Wisconsin Rural Art Show. Schwalbach has been conferring with sponsoring groups to set dates for regional shows, which will start late this month or early in February.

One-day art schools in each area have been scheduled. Another change in the setup is expected to permit almost every county to have at least one regional show every five years. This will be accomplished through rotating sponsorship among the counties in each region.

"This long-term plan," Schwalbach said, "will make it possible to bring the art shows closer to the people, and lighten the sponsorship load on each agricultural extension office. These offices handle details of the shows."

Here is the regional schedule for 1951 as it stands now, with location of each show, date of each one-day school, and names of participating counties:

FIFTH HILL AND VALLEY—Viroqua; school, Feb. 3. La Crosse, Monroe, Juneau, Sauk, Richland, Crawford, and Vernon counties.

SEVENTH CENTRAL—Wausau; school, Feb. 10. Taylor, Clark, Wood, Adams, Portage, Shawano, and Marathon counties.

SIXTH EASTERN—Mequon; school, May 12. Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, Washington, and Ozaukee counties.

FIFTH GREEN BAY—Algoma; school, Feb. 24. Oconto, Brown, Door, Calumet, Manitowish, and Kewaunee counties.

SIXTH TRI-COUNTY—Lancaster; school, Mar. 3. Iowa, Lafayette, and Grant counties.

FIFTH WESTERN—Chippewa Falls; school, Mar. 10. Rusk, Dunn, St. Croix, Pierce, Pepin, Eau Claire, Buffalo, Trempealeau, Jackson, and Chippewa counties.

SIXTH NORTH CENTRAL—Ashland; school, Mar. 17. Bayfield, Sawyer, Price, Iron, and Ashland counties.

FIFTH NORTHWESTERN—Spooner; school, Mar. 31. Douglas, Burnett, Polk, Barron, and Washburn counties.

FIRST WOLF RIVER—Winnebago; school, Apr. 7. Waupaca, Waushara, Marquette, Green Lake, Outagamie, and Winnebago counties.

FIFTH SOUTH CENTRAL—Ft. Atkinson; school, Apr. 14. Columbia, Dodge, Dane, Green, Rock, and Jefferson counties.

SIXTH SOUTHEASTERN—Racine; school, Apr. 21. Waukesha,

Milwaukee, Walworth, Kenosha, and Racine counties.

SIXTH NORTHEASTERN—Rhinelander; school, May 5. Vilas, Lincoln, Langlade, Forest, Florence, Marinette and Oneida counties.

At each stop, it will film and record the voices of the heads of governments, relief officials, and refugees. The films and recordings then will be used for two network broadcasts, one on television and the other on radio, so that churchgoers may be able to understand at first hand the extent of the suffering.

Tentative plans call for these special programs being heard and seen on the world Day of Prayer, Feb. 9.

The "One Great Time for Sharing" appeal is the first major service project to be conducted in connection with the newly formed National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.
