Sec. Marshall Asks Wide Dispersal of Military Contracts to Spur Output

Marshall recently called upon the Army, Navy and Air Force to spread contracts across industry as widely as possible in order to broaden the scope of the military procurement program, to obtain urgently needed goods faster, and to take up the slack in industry now facing cutbacks because of materials shortages.

The directive of the military departments, which was based upon recommendations of the Department of Defense Munitions Board, also is designed to afford greater security by bringing a greater number of firms into military production.


