IDYLLWILD, Jan. 10. (AP) The Marines are going in for winter training in national forest areas of San Jacinto Mountains. First units from Camp Pendleton are establishing headquarters today, with Capt. Walter Moore, Los Angeles, in charge of the program.
Infantrymen, artillerymen and tank men will undergo training under tough conditions with individual and small unit survival emphasized. They'll learn to shift for themselves in isolated situations, to prepare meals without fire and treat frostbite.
