Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT Serigraph Show

TIP O' THE MORNING: Sir Laurence Olivier's "Hamlet" will return to the Parkway theater Jan. 15-20.

Something relatively new in the field of art has gone on exhibition at the Wisconsin Union theater gallery. It is a collection of 56 serigraphs by members of the National Serigraph society, and it will be on view through Jan. 21.

Serigraphs are the results of working with the silk-screen process. Doris Metzger, director of the society, emphasizes the fact that a serigraph is not a reproduction. Everything is done by the artist, from the stenciling to the printing.

Syd Fossum, a judge of the 1949 Wisconsin Salon of Art at the Union, is among the artists represented in the show. Fossum is exhibiting "Maine Scene." Among the other nationally known artists and their works are Robert Gwathmey, "Ring-Around-A-Rosey"; Edward Landon, "Scandinavia"; and "Forms in White." Ernest Hopf, "Rank and File" and "Along the Delaware," and Leonard Pylak, "Will-O'-the-Wisps" and "Sails."

CASALS FESTIVAL: Another festival at Perpignan, France, near Prades, under the direction of Pablo Casals will be held in June, 1951, devoted to the music of Bach, Mozart, and Beethoven.

The word has been brought back by the pianist Eugene Istomin, who stayed in Prades for almost five months after taking part in the Bach festival last spring.

The 25-year-old New York-born pianist, who has made appearances with the New York Philharmonic Symphony as well as with other major orchestras since winning the Leventritt award in the autumn of 1943, made his first European tour in the spring and summer of 1950, appearing in France, Italy, and Switzerland. The Prades festival was the highlight of his trip.
