Nine Holidays Set by Chamber in Karnes City

KARNES CITY.—The Chamber of Commerce has set nine holiday dates for 1951. One holiday falls on Sunday and will be observed on Monday. All business firms will observe these dates with the usual exceptions.

The dates set are as follows: Washington's Birthday, Feb. 22; Good Friday, Friday, March 23; Memorial Day, Wednesday, May 30; Independence Day, Wednesday, July 4; Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 3; Armistice Day, Sunday Nov. 11 (will be observed on Monday, Nov. 12); Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, Nov. 22, (fourth Thursday); Christmas Day, Tuesday, Dec. 25; New Year's Day, Tuesday, Jan. 1, 1952.

Work to Peak This Summer On Falcon Dam

LAREDO.—Work on the Falcon Dam will reach a peak in June or July, according to R. B. Collins, field engineer for the U.S. section of the International Boundary and Water Commission.

Activity at the damsite, 75 miles downstream on the Rio Grande from Laredo, is steadily increasing as men, materials and equipment move in.

Boundary commission construction headquarters are at Fort McIntosh, Laredo, with field offices being established at Falcon Village.

LAREDO.—A junior livestock show will be held here March 1 in connection with the renewed Pan American Livestock Show and the International Fair and Exposition, Don Finley, general chairman for the show, has announced.

The show is open to any boy feeding and grooming animals under supervision of the county agricultural agent or a vocational agricultural teacher.

Calves will be judged by market grades of choice, good medium and common and will be in two classes, under and over 750 pounds.

Twelve calves already have been entered by 4-H club youths and there are 15 entries from P.F.A. boys.
