Fred Allen Decides to Stick With Radio

NEW YORK, Jan. 13. Fred Allen is getting set to go back into radio for the rest of this season after just about giving up television. He did take another TV fling over the week end as a guest in the NBC-TV comedy hour for Jerry Lester, who was doing what would have been Allen's regular assignment.

Allen's radio spot will be a series of readings in the Tallulah Bankhead big show on NBC Sunday evenings. He already has done several, but under the new arrangement which begins next week end he will return regularly every other week.

Fred's decision to forego television as a featured personality with his own show is declared to be partly due to the critical reception he got and partly to the fact that a suitable format failed to materialize after four tries.
