IN ALLIED HANDS

Tungsten-rich Area Korea Battlefield

U. S. EIGHTH ARMY HEADQUARTERS, Korea, Jan. 17. (AP) Korea's main source of mineral wealth is now part of the United Nations battlefield.

Yongwol, a dusty little town of 15,000 persons about 15 miles east of Chechon, is the site of a rich vein of tungsten (wolfram) ore, vital in the hardening of steel. It has changed hands at least twice in the fight on the central front and last was reported in Allied hands.

Tungsten has been Korea's chief source of revenue from minerals.
