Klipstein to Get Stock; Court Rules Other Claims Out

Federal Judge Patrick T. Stone ruled here Thursday that George F. Klipstein, Cheyenne, Wyo., is entitled to receive 37 shares of stock in the Capital Auto Body Co., 1920 Winnebago st.

The court, after a half day testimony, disallowed all other claims by Klipstein; held that he owns no interest in the building occupied by the company; and ab-solved company officers and di-rectors of all improper management and accounting charges.

Klipstein, who was service man-

ager of the plant about two years, had demanded that the building, purchased from the Kupfer Foundry and Iron Co., be declared

company property.

He also charged that company officers were paid excessive salaries and made improper with drawals of company funds.
Stone held, however, that men

bers of the Gilomen family, Walter E., Martha, Edward and Marie had purchased the building with their own money and leased it to the company at a reasonable ren

tal charge.

He also ruled that Walter Gilomen's salary as manager was reasonable.

Klipstein left the company's employ suddenly, testimony showed, and the Gilomen family testified that for years they had had no word from him.
