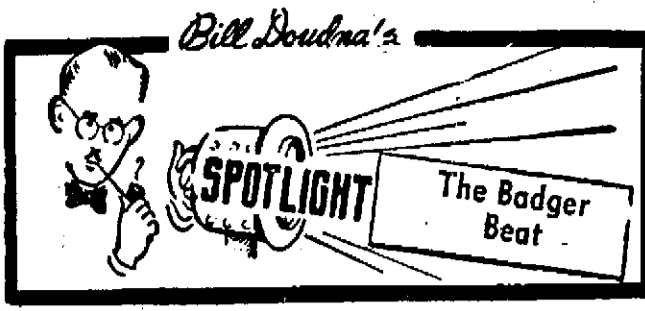

TIP O' THE MORNING: Top novelty song in England is "I Taut I Taw a Puddy Tat." Mel Blanc has recorded it in this country, and it looks like a hit here, too.

Tom Ewell's (ex-UW) new contract with Universal is only for two pictures a year and doesn't confine his activities to that studio, Edith Gwynn reports from Hollywood.

Most pictures are seen around Hollywood by producers and others in their private projection rooms—long before the public sees them. And it's this sort of "grapevine" that makes many actors hot before the public gets a squint at them.

Chiff Roberts, who did a fine job handling concert broadcasts on WHA, is now in New Orleans on both radio and TV.
