France Proposes European Army

Calls Paris Meeting on International Unit

PARIS (AP)—France invited a divided and frightened West Europe Friday to stop its squabbling and put its fighting men into one type of uniform in one international army.

The first assignment for such a force would be to make its armed strength available to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's Atlantic alliance command, Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers in Europe (SHAPE).

British Hold Key

The British attitude may decide whether the project goes over. Britain's Labor government will be enthusiastic. It has been cool toward federalization of Europe.

The French scheme appeared as dramatic as Winston Churchill's appeal in the spring of 1940, when Europe was crumbling before Hitler's divisions, that Britain and France unite as a single nation to fight on.

The idea of a European army, in fact, originated with Churchill. The former British prime minister and "elder statesman" of European unity called for a unified European army last Aug. 11 before a Council of Europe meeting in Strasbourg.

But it remained for the French to put the idea to work and invite the nations of free Europe to come to Paris Feb. 6 and do something about it.

Marshfield Woman Succeeds Hodgkins on U.W. Regents

Mrs. Helen C. Laird, Marshfield, was appointed a University of Wisconsin regent by Gov. Walter Kohler today to succeed Walter Hodgkins, Ashland, who resigned.

Hodgkins, a member of the board of regents for 12 years, resigned because of poor health, the governor's office said.

Mrs. Laird is the mother of Sen. Melvin Laird, Jr. (R-Marshfield). Her husband, the late Melvin Laird, Sr., also was a state senator.

She is secretary of the Connor Lumber and Land Co., Marshfield, and a member of the state library commission.

She will resign her library post. Mrs. Laird also has served on the Marshfield library board and the city's board of education.

Mrs. Laird will be the first woman member of the board of regents since 1943.

Kohler said he appointed a woman because "the interest of the women of Wisconsin in the university is fully as great as the interest of men, and they should have a strong voice in its affairs."

Kohler lauded Hodgkins for "outstanding service" on the board. He said the Ashland regent had "made a real contribution to the growth and development of the university."

Hodgkins had been appointed to a new nine-year term on the board by former Gov. Oscar Rennebohm last spring.
