# **European Army**

### Calls Paris Meeting on International Unit

PARIS - (P) - France invited a divided and frightened West Europe Friday to stop its squabbling and put its fighting men into one type of uniform in one international army.

The first assignment for such a

force would be to make its armed strength available to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's Atlantic alliance command, Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers in Europe (SHAPE). So far individual nations have pledged Eisenhower only about a dozen divisions.

British Hold Key The British attitude may decide whether the project goes over. Precedent does not indicate that Britain's Labor government will enthusiastic. It has been cool toward federalization of Europe.

The French scheme appeared as dramatic as Winston Churchill's appeal in the spring of 1940, when Europe was crumbling before Hit-ler's divisions, that Britain and France unite as a single nation to

The idea of a European army, in fact, originated with Churchill. The former British prime minister and "elder statesman" of European unity called for a unified European army last Aug. 11 before a Council of Europe meeting in Strasbourg. Invitation Sent

But it remained for the French to put the idea to work and in-vite the nations of free Europe to come to Paris Feb. 6 and do some-thing about it.


