FROM BULGARIA TO FRANCE

Man Travels 34 Days Inside Case

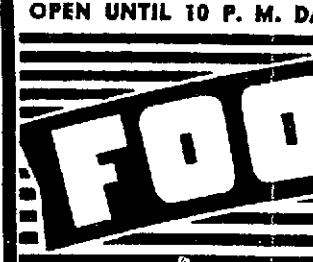
PARIS, Jan. 29. (AP) French newspaper today reported the mysterious odyssey of a man who traveled from Bulgaria to France—in a packing case.

The man, reportedly named Christov, spent 34 days in the case, which contained a Ford automobile. Papers speculated he might be a French secret service agent, or a refugee from behind the iron curtain.

They generally agreed that French police had been alerted for the arrival of the man in the case at Marseille last week, on the Italian ship Palazzi. Two police from Paris arrived in Marseille and opened the case, which had been sitting on the docks for two days, and found the man, described as in the 30s, and with a beard, sitting at the wheel of the automobile.

American Diplomats Conferring in Paris

PARIS, Jan. 29. (AP) American diplomats today began the first of three meetings called for on-the-spot reviews of U. S. policies abroad.

First on the list is a study of problems besetting U. S. diplomatic missions behind the iron curtain. Five chiefs of missions in Communist countries are meeting in Paris, under the chairmanship of George W. Perkins, the State Department's secretary for European affairs.

Another has been arranged in Frankfurt Feb. 5 to 8, for ambassadors to west European nations, and a third in Istanbul Feb. 14 to 21 for U. S. representatives in the Arab states, Israel, Greece, Turkey and Iran.
