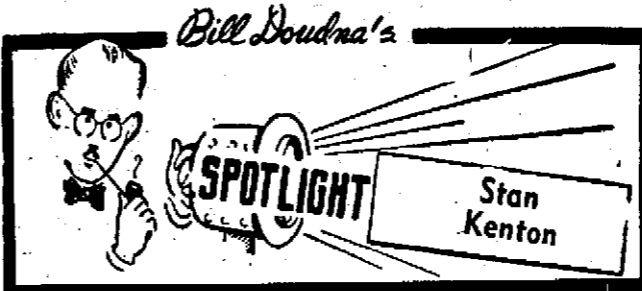

TIP O' THE MORNING: The "Truth or Consequences" show in which Pfc. and Mrs. William Klein, Madison, took part a couple of weeks ago was recorded and will reach the air at 8:30 p. m. Tuesday via CBS-WBBM.

Stan Kenton's current tour, which brings him to the Orpheum theater Tuesday, is primarily a series of dance engagements—but his program here hasn't been announced. However, the band is somewhat smaller than the concert group which he brought with him last time. These two facts—plus the billing of a tap dancer on the program—seems to indicate an emphasis on dance rather than concert music.

Manager Hugh Flannery of the Orpheum reports unusually high interest in the engagement. Consequently, he has scheduled five stage shows instead of the usual four. Deors will open at 12:15 p.m., the first showing of the movie "Radar Secret Service" will be at 12:35, and the first Kenton show will be at 1:40.

Capitol Records has issued a Kenton concert of six sides in a 45-rpm album. All the pieces are "Progressive jazz." They serve mainly to spotlight the musician-ship of Maynard Ferguson, trumpet; Shelly Manne, drums; June Christy, voice, and Art Pepper, alto sax. You'll find virtuosity here, and fresh musical ideas—even if you don't like the music.

Four of the numbers were written around these soloists; the other two are "Halls of Brass" and "House of Strings," whose content the titles make obvious.

Especially arresting is Miss Christy's lyrical singing. For this reviewer, it's by far the best work she has done. It shows versatility and a flexible voice—and sincerity, too.

Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis will have four flickers finished for Hal Wallis, under their contract with him, by the end of 1951. The first, "That's My Boy" is done; their second, "The Stooge" starts shooting Feb. 5. Then the boys go into N. Y.'s Copa Cabana for eight weeks. Dean and Jerry are permitted one outside (or independently produced) picture each year—and our guess is that it will be made at 20th-Fox come summer. Jimmy Stewart will have a chance to recover from his current fatigue because he doesn't join Cornel Wilde, Betty Hutton, Dotty Lamour, et al. in Florida, where much of "The Greatest Show on Earth" will be made. He catches up with the company a couple months from now for his bit in same.
