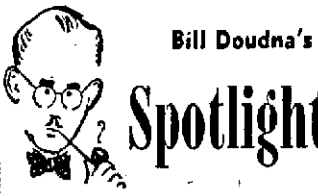

### Spotlight

**TIP O' THE MORNING:** A shirt manufacturer may take over Drew Pearson's radio sponsorship.

One of the most difficult things a non-professional acting group can do is revive a play which has been seen in its community, with a first-rate cast, within the memory of much of the audience.

The Madison Theater Guild did just that Thursday night at West high school with Emyln Williams' "The Corn Is Green." And the result was successful.

Marjorie Schaffer, in the role which Ethel Barrymore played here in 1942 and 1943, and Patricia McKune, as the cockney girl originally played by Thelma Schnee, gave sterling performances.

"The Corn Is Green" is the story of an English spinster who decides to spend her inheritance in rural Wales. She meets apparently insuperable obstacles, and almost gives up.

Then she discovers a brilliant mind behind the blackened face of a young miner and adopts warmly a gule long enough to win the village squire to her side. A wanton, selfish girl almost deprives her of the privilege of seeing her protegee go to Oxford via scholarship, but she solves this problem, too.

Miss Schaffer played the teacher, Miss Moffat, with skill and understanding, emphasizing the woman's quiet determination through her earnest approach.

Miss McKune made the girl, Bessie, mature rapidly before one's eyes, even as she defined the essential selfishness and amorality of the young cockney.

DuWayne Carlson handed the young miner's role well for the first two acts, especially in a climactic scene in which he tried to dissolve his intellectual partnership with Miss Moffat. But the part suffered from a speedup in his lines and an abrupt drop of accent in the last act.

Paul F. Hunter gave a workmanlike picture of hvmn-singing John Gowroy Jones and Joan Knott won laughs with her version of a man-hopeful spinster, DeAlton Nelson's brief appearance as Old Tom, an ancient pupil, was a high spot among the minor roles. Edward Karmack's work as the egoistic squire was good, too.

Robert Merriman's direction and J. Fyfe Fredericksen's setting deserves commendation.

The play will be repeated at 8:15 tonight in West high and at 8:15 p. m. Saturday in East's auditorium.

**HEADING SOUTH:** Bob Howard, who has been a disc jockey and announcer at WKOW for 19

months, will sign off that station Saturday to go to New Orleans. There he will join the announcing staff of WDSU. That's the station on which Cliff Roberts, formerly of WHA, is doing television work.

Jerry Harper, who has been handling weekend shows on WKOW, will take over Howard's programs next week. He used to be at WISC.

**HIGH POINTS:** Model Marcia Mitchell recognizes the killer of the news man as her sister's new husband, Hank Rice.
